ABEL GANZ was formed in 1980 by keyboard player Hew Montgomery and multi-instrumentalist Hugh Carter. Although both had played in various bands together over the years, it was a shared interest in progressive rock that brought about the birth of Abel Ganz. Alan Reed (Pallas) joined the band, and they recorded their first album 'Gratuitous Flash' in 1983, followed by 'Gullibles Travels' and 'The Dangers Of Strangers'. Abel Ganz signed to F2 in October 1999, and this release features remastered tracks from the bands first three (and best) albums.
